Marty was raised a Master Mason on November 19, 1976 in Morton Lodge #469. Served as Worshipful Master 5 times and has served as Secretary for 16 years. He is a member of the Terre Haute Valley of Scottish Rite, a Life member of Murat Shrine, Greencastle York Rite Bodies; Robert Woods Priory #62 KYCH; Banks of the Wabash Y.R. College #72; Cloverdale Chapter #369 OES; Edward Etchison Council AMD; Terre Haute Preceptory; Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests and the Red Cross of Constantine. He received his Order of the Purple Cross in 2010. He is currently serving as Eminent Prior of Robert Woods Priory.
