

WILLIAM B. SMITH, PGHP MEMORIAL

Saturday morning, April 23 at 10:30 A.M., members and representatives of Webb Lodge #24, Richmond Lodge #196, King Solomon Chapter #4, RAM; the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Indiana; and the General Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons International gathered at the grave site of Most Excellent Companion William B Smith, PGHP, PM to re-dedicate the monument marking his grave site. The grave is located near the top of a hill in Earlham Cemetery, Richmond, Indiana.

The ceremony was performed near the top of one of the highest hills in the cemetery and under the Flag of the United States of America. The weather was cool and the sun shone bright. This seemed appropriate for the first re-dedication ceremony.

William B Smith was the first Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Indiana. He was also the first Worshipful Master of Richmond Lodge #196 and a Past Master of Webb Lodge #24. The monument that marks his grave was erected by the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of the State of Indiana in cooperation with the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Indiana, King Solomon Chapter #4, RAM, Webb Lodge #24, and Richmond Lodge #196.

The ceremony began with the Pledge of Allegiance followed by a brief history of Most Excellent Companion Smith's Masonic and Professional career. A carnation was placed on the monument by representatives from Webb Lodge #24, Richmond Lodge #196, King Solomon Chapter #4, RAM, the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Indiana, and the General Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons International.

Following the ceremony, the Companions and their ladies retired to King Solomon Chapter #4 for a Table Chapter in honor of Most Excellent Companion William B. Smith, PGHP.
