On June 28th, 2014, about sixty Companions and their families gathered in the Linton Masonic Lodge to receive their Dispensation to operate as Greene County Chapter, Under Dispensation.

In August of 2013, the Grand High Priest was approached by four Royal Arch Masons from Greene County: Danny Gadbury, Gary Roberts, Kent Harting and Keith Burris; requesting information on how to start an active York Rite in their area. The four Companions and the Grand High Priest met for lunch at a Cracker Barrel in Indianapolis and it was suggested to them that they start with one body, get it up and running and then build the other groups.

The suggestion was followed, recruiting meetings were held and early in 2014, seventeen Royal Arch Masons petitioned the Grand Chapter for Dispensation to operate. Their petition was granted by the Grand Chapter at the Grand Convocation in April and the official Dispensation presentation was made on June 28th.

Excellent Companion Shelby Olvey will serve as High Priest during the Dispensation, along with Danny Gadbury as King, Keith Burris and Gary Roberts as Secretary. The U.D. Chapter already has another twelve candidates in process for membership and participated in a local 4th of July Parade; so it appears that Greene County U.D. is off to a great start. MATT BACKUS - RESPONSIBILITY AND FREEMASONRY

This study comes again from Most Excellent Companion Steven Tiner, PGHP of the Grand Chapter of Arkansas.

"To the doors of the Chapter room comes the young Mason, fresh from the Altar of the Symbolic Degrees, where he has served due time as an Apprentice, wrought therein as a Fellow Craft, and now comes bearing the title of Master with the working tools in his hand, eagerly seeking more light and ready to prove his skill. He knows that Capitular Masonry will take him farther into this new and interesting science, and he wants to proceed and learn. He now enters, symbolically, upon the responsibilities of life. Henceforth his work will be judged on its own merits. It must be good, true, and square. Masonry is moral geometry. The angles must all be right angles; the surfaces must all be square; length, breadth, and height are all equal. Of course, these dimensions are symbolical of the proportions of a perfect man. Our imperfect work in these earthly quarries is rejected. We are all imperfect and lopsided in one way or another, so we must try again and again. It is an example of the geometry of manhood."

Most Excellent Companion Tiner offers us something to consider on a much deeper level. He says that when we step into becoming a Capitular Mason, we are now symbolically entering upon the responsibilities of life. By the explanations of what we learn in Capitular Masonry, I do tend to agree; where I disagree is that as a Mason we are being schooled in responsibility from our first lessons as an Entered Apprentice onward.

While all Masons have a lifelong goal of perfecting a rough ashlar, it is a goal that is not so easily achieved. Our responsibilities revolve around the development and maintenance of our character. To manage our time properly, to eliminate bad habit and unnecessary activities which might poorly effect us, to be moral and upright, to be honest and full of integrity, to be mindful of equality toward all mankind...these are heavy responsibilities!

We can learn all about Masonry! It's an enjoyable hobby. Making Masonry part of your daily existence doesn't mean being at every function, sitting as the presiding officer or a master ritualist...it means being aware of the application of your working tools, living by the teachings, praying for guidance and providence and so much more.

We also read in MEC's quote that we are all "imperfect and lopsided". We have no way of reaching perfection in the flesh. We have no time to waste in trying, however. If we take the time to understand our flaws and take action to overcome them, we step closer!
